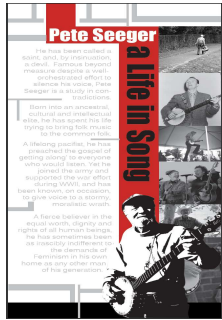




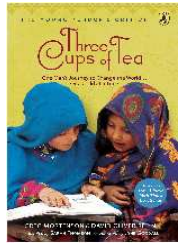
Exhibit News

July Peace Café

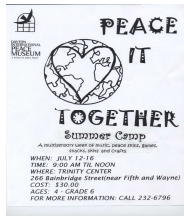
